KNLT Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center is back with your weekly Snow Report!

Mother Nature is taking her time blanketing us with snow this season so why not take advantage to get your gear and your brain tuned up.

Weather forecasters are calling for cooler temps, some snow and light winds this week. Be prepared with beacon, shovel, and probe if you venture into the backcountry.

Hatcher Pass trails remain closed to motorized riders due to low snow levels. Hiking and biking should be good, but be aware of changing conditions as we go through the week.

Down Turnagain Pass way forecasters report the avalanche danger as CONSIDERABLE. Recent snow and wind contribute to unstable conditions. Be cautious and conservative in route planning and decision-making!

In the Mat-Su, lakes are freezing with colder temperatures, but snowmobiling is not advised at this time.
