



2016-17 Country Legends – Trail Report

Eh Ha! Calling all snow riders! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center brings you this report thanks to support from AARP Alaska and Country Legends.

The National Weather Service is forecasting cold temps throughout Southcentral the next several days with a chance of snow later this week on the Kenai Peninsula and perhaps out the eastern end of the Glenn Hwy. If you're heading into the backcountry, be prepared with warm clothing and stay alert and aware.

Be advised that avalanches have been reported in the Turnagain Pass area and the danger is rated as MODERATE. Get informed of current conditions at [Alaska Snow dot org](http://AlaskaSnow.org) before you venture out.

No trail reports from the Eureka area yet this year but stay tuned! Mat-Su all-season trails still need more snow for motorized use. Hatcher Pass trails Archangel and Independence Mine have been groomed for skiers and bikers and users report good condition.
