## KMBQ Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Q99.7 Snow Report thanks to support from AARP Alaska!

For all you powder hounds, Turnagain Pass and portions of the Kenai Mountains have a bit of new snow! The avalanche danger is MODERATE and caution and conservative planning is highly recommended. With cold temps and wind, be sure to take extra layers, your beacon, probe, shovel, and, most important, keep alert and aware of your surroundings!

Cross-country ski trails in Hatcher Pass, Anchorage Upper Hillside, and Kinkaid Park have been groomed and are reported to be in good condition.

Mat-Su and Glenn Hwy-Eureka area trails still need more snow for motorized travel but hikers and fat-bikers should find the trails perfect. We'll see if the storm dumping snow on Thompson Pass spreads flakes north!
