



## 2016-17 Country Legends – Snow Rider Report

Eh Ha! Greetings snow riders! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center brings you this report thanks to generous support from AARP Alaska and Country Legends.

This coming week expect a few more inches of snow. North toward Talkeetna, expect up to five inches between Thursday and Sunday, with clearing and colder temps into next week.

Turnagain Pass is now open to snowmachiners, However advisories report avalanche danger as CONSIDERABLE in the alpine and treeline elevations, especially on slopes steeper than 35 degrees, with MODERATE danger below 1000 foot elevations. Cautious route planning and conservative decision-making are essential in your backcountry planning this week.

If you plan to ride on the lakes, or rivers be alert and watch for ice ridges and overflow.

Remember if you are heading into the mountains go prepared. Take your beacon, shovel and probe and know how to use them so you can ***Live to Ride Another Day!***
