Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from Moving 105.7!

The rollercoaster of wild weather is expected to continue this week. Forecasters are calling for a river of warm, moist snowfall across Southcentral Alaska through the weekend keeping avalanche danger extremely high.

Travel in mountain terrain is not recommended due to continued heavy snow, rain and strong winds in all Southcentral mountain regions. According to the Hatcher Pass Avalanche Center, you'll find a battleground of avalanches throughout the pass and this is expected to continue with snowfall and temperatures hovering near 32 degrees.

Given the dangerous conditions, skiers, cyclers, and snowmachine riders should stick to trails in flat terrain or managed areas where avalanche mitigation controls are in place. Trails have been groomed at Nancy Lakes and Denali State Park trail systems as well as the Eureka and John Lake trails out the Glenn Highway. Overflow warnings are in place for most lakes in and rivers in the Southcentral area. Stay safe!
