95.5 The Pass Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from 95.5 the Pass!

Don't put away your hats and gloves just yet, forecasters are calling for clear, cold and windy conditions this week with little to no precipitation expected.

Snow forecasters report avalanche danger moderate to considerable. Stay alert for wind slabs and loose powder. Be sure to get the most current avalanche information at Alaska Snow dot org before you venture into the backcountry.

Last week's snow blanketed area trails and slopes with three to 12 inches of fresh powder making this a great time to get out and enjoy Alaska. Just bundle up in layers for comfort. And remember wind transports snow quickly.

Snowmachine riders will find trails open from Hatcher Pass to Turnagain Pass to Denali National Park to Lake Louise.

Be advised that overflow warnings remain in place for many area lakes and rivers, including Nancy Lakes trail system, Byers Lake inlet and outlet waters, and the Eagle River Greenbelt and North Fork Access areas.
