We still have nice cool mornings making for firm, fast cruising conditions early in the day, with softening snow in the afternoon and evening.

Trails in Hatcher Pass and around the Turnagain area still have good snow for touring and longer days means you can cruise later in the afternoon and evening without the crowds. Just expect this to end soon with warm afternoons and deteriorating conditions.
